News from this week:





| <p>News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?</p> | | | <p>Monday 9th - Friday 13th June Year 1 Phonics Screen Check</p>  |
| <p>EYFS: We've had such a busy week this week. We have been discussing a special celebration that some of our teachers and friends celebrate. We've been making Eid cards and decorations for our class. We have also been making Mothers Day cards and watching how different countries celebrate Mother's Day. This week we have welcomed a new adult in our class Ms Rayna and she will be working with us until the summer term, we've been busy getting to know her! We've also spent some time reading the Easter Story and the importance of the last meal with Jesus's disciples.</p> | <p>Year 1: We have had a busy week in Year 1. We enjoyed our e-safety lesson on making healthy choices when using technology - ask us about this at home! We also completed our assessments and everybody did an amazing job - well done! We enjoyed our RE Pause Day where we learnt about the story of Easter and created a tomb for Jesus with split pins - after learning about the resurrection. We also completed our computing unit on data and labelling - and we created cards for Mothering Sunday celebrating people who look after us at home. Good job!</p> | <p>Year 2: Year 2 have put so much effort and focus into their assessments this week, I am so proud of how resilient and focussed they have been and we have all shown amazing progress with our learning. This week we also spent time reflecting on the importance of symbols at Easter and made some lovely Easter gardens!</p> | <p>Monday 14th - Wednesday 16th July Year 6 Ufton Court Residential</p>  |
| <p>Year 3: This week year 3 have been working extremely hard to complete their assessments. Each child has shown a great amount of resilience and motivation to achieve their best. Educational Psychology Parent Advice Sessions


The Parent Advice Sessions are open to all children and families living in Hackney including those children not yet in school, children who are out of school, children who live in Hackney and attend school in other boroughs
