



At the end of the week, we were very excited to meet our new Year 1 teacher and see our new classroom,

Year 1:

In year 1, we enjoyed learning and singing our song with the whole school, and enjoyed showing off our cultural outfits to each other. To mark Science Week we enjoyed using our baby shark fingers to feel different plants, came up with our own plant invention and created paper ring caterpillars. We have had a really busy and exciting week this week! We enjoyed singing our song during cultural heritage day and we have been working very hard with Mr Cook. We also took a trip to the Museum of the Home in Hoxton where we explored some of the rooms and took part in a print and pattern workshop.

<p>Year 3:</p> <p>This week, Year 3 had an amazing opportunity to visit the <i>Museum of the Home</i>. During the trip, the children explored three different homes from various eras and countries. They were fascinated by how homes have changed over time, and afterwards, they used their creativity to design and make their very own dream homes!</p> <p>In Maths, we have started an exciting new topic. The children are learning how to identify different types of polygons and how to decompose them into smaller shapes. They're doing a great job so far!</p>	<p>Year 4:</p> <p>We have had another lovely week in the sunshine! On Monday we performed our beautiful song about Harmony and Diversity in our Culture Day celebration. In writing we have been working hard on our assessment and created imaginative invention narratives of our own.</p> <p>In maths we have been learning how to divide with remainders and answering tricky reasoning problems! For Science and Sustainability week, we have been making our own compost bins and even including worms in these as a lovely habitat for them!</p>	<p>Year 5:</p> <p>Year 5 really enjoyed science week, this week. They engaged in a sustainability project that involved a clothes swap, they really enjoyed this and learnt how important it is to recycle materials. Alongside this, they engaged in an activity, which linked to their first science unit on forces. Using hangers and objects of different weights, they made their own pulley, investigating whether using a pulley made a difference in how easy it is to carry objects.</p> <p>Within maths, year 5 have continued working on fractions, showing great understanding and applying their knowledge to reasoning questions.</p> <p>In writing we made predictions on our final book of the academic year, delving into the illustrations and some bits of the text, they showed amazing engagement and enthusiasm.</p> <p>I have been really impressed with Y5 this week, well done!</p>
<p>Year 6: This week, in Year 6, we took part in activities for Science Week and Sustainability. We discussed the impact of chemical cleaning products on our environment and came up with our own natural cleaning products. Later in the week, we conducted a science experiment looking at how microplastics filter into our oceans.</p>


